
- 1. Entry Sign Improvements enhancing the visual appearance and legibility through a cohesive signage scheme.

- 3. Main Street Improvements installation of new sidewalks and bump-outs from Waubonsie Avenue to Orange Street and streetscape beautification.
- 4. Promoting Historic Values recruiting new businesses by promoting Tabor's historic buildings and vestiges with sidewalks and signage.
- 5. Main Street Amenities proposing a splash park -or- zero depth splash pad, along with a new library and a welcome center. Also included are: a pocket park layout development and mural relocation/renovation.
- 6. Tabor City Park Improvements parking and drainage improvements around the perimeter, update play equipment, and creating more definition and organization at the northwest corner of the park.



Entry Signage Improvements

Tabor currently has one sign welcoming people to the community. The sign is located south of town along Highway 275, which is the Loess Hills National Scenic Byway. The existing entry sign is fairly small, a significant distance from the road, and is difficult to read at times. The sign is made of dark wood planks and uses wood burning to inscribe "Welcome to Tabor" into the planks. The contrast of the lettering and the wood is not as strong as what many would like to see, as it often is unseen by visitors. At one point, Tabor had an entry sign on Highway 275 north of town, but inclement weather damaged the sign and the property owner decided replacing it would not be ideal.

As Tabor is bisected by the Loess Hills National Scenic Byway from north to south, the steering committee deemed it necessary to have signage on both the north and south sides of town. The north entry sign is to be located in an area that works within the requirements set forth by the lowa Department of Transportation, as well as adjacent property owners. The south entry sign is in a great location, but needs complimentary scaled plantings.

Thematic Elements

Tabor has a fascinating history of prominent abolitionists and progressive thinkers. The town's role in the Underground Railroad can be easily overlooked by many who are simply passing by on Highway 275. Implementing a well thought-out symbol or thematic element can create a sense of strong character and community for the residents and visitors of Tabor.

A resident of Tabor has begun work on a particular graphic that will be used in the historic Tabor Cemetery, and specifically at the graves of Underground Railroad Conductors. The graphic is a sketch of a lantern, reminiscent of those used in Tabor during that era. This lantern has been accepted by Tabor residents as an icon/symbol that could be used throughout town to serve as a unifying element without being "too cute". Finding a way to utilize this lantern with a combination of Tabor historical and geographical context, may contribute fun, positive, and educational attributes to Tabor.



Design Expertise Recommended

Projects may require help beyond the capability of the Tabor Visioning Steering Committee or available city staff. For this improvement project, the steering committee should expect to engage the services of a Landscape Architect.

Project Scope and Cost Opinion

These costs may be reduced with materials donated or provided at reduced cost and volunteer labor for appropriate projects. 
